Reds Hall of Fame

The Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame's **Class of 2010** will be announced at a press conference Tuesday at 4:30 p.m. in the Hall of Fame.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of the Reds' final series of the 2009 season, a 3-game set vs **Jimmy Trdinich's** Pirates, and **Game 4** (2-1) of a 6-game homestand that also included a 2-1 series win vs the **Cardinals**...the Reds and **Make-A-Wish Foundation** tonight are hosting 9-year-old **Keegan Blosser** of nearby Centerville...**Keegan** will play catch with **Joey Votto**, will pitch to **Ryan Hanigan** and will serve as the team's honorary bat boy.

STREAKING: The Reds have won 8 of their last 10g, 12 of their last 16g and 25 of their last 37g...in the last 16g **Reds batters** are hitting .285 (153-536) with 91 runs scored (5.7 r/g), including a team-best .456 by **Joey Votto** (26-57, 14 2b, 12rbi)...**Reds pitchers** in the last 16g have posted a 3.15era (143ip, 50er)...**Reds relievers** in the last 16g have posted a 2.74era (42.2ip, 13er), dropping the bullpen's overall ERA from **3.70** to **3.62**...**Reds starters** in the last 13g have posted a 2.98era (81.2ip, 27er).

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Redlegs have won 19 of their last 23g vs **NL Central** opponents and are **44-33 (.571)** within the division overall...the Reds' next victory will be **Dusty Baker's** 1,313th as manager, which will tie him with **Ned Hanlon** for 27th on the all-time list...**Reds defenders** so far have produced a **.985 fielding percentage**, which would establish a franchise record for a non-strike season (.984, 6 times, last in 2007).

IN SEPTEMBER: The Reds' 18 wins last month were their most in September since **2000** (18-11)...haven't won more than 18 games to finish a season *beginning 9/1* since the exciting **1999** club went **20-12** in September/October.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **1B Joey Votto** hit **16 doubles** in September, the most by any player in the Major Leagues last month and a club record for a calendar month (**Harry Heilmann**, 15 doubles, **July 1930**)...last week **Votto** became the first Major League batter to hit 10 doubles in a 5-game span since Pit's **Paul Waner** did it in **1932**...hit 5 of those doubles vs the Pirates as part of a stretch in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps, raising his BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

CLIMBING THE STANDINGS: For the 10th straight day the Reds are in fourth place in the National League Central Division...before climbing to fourth on 9/22, the Reds spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds trail third-place Mil by only 1.0g and lead the fifth-place Astros by 2.0g...**Cin can clinch fourth place** with any combination of Reds wins and Astros losses totaling 2.

MILESTONES: **Brandon Phillips** (95rbi) is trying to become only the second Reds second baseman ever to produce 100rbi in a season (**Joe Morgan**, 1976, 110 of his 111rbi as a 2B)...**Joey Votto** (.317) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (39sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**.

20-20-20: **Brandon Phillips** is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases in *3 consecutive seasons*...**Phillips** and Fla's **Hanley Ramirez** are the only Major League players to do it in each of the last 3 years.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **114 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **114-80**...allowed first-inning runs in 56 of their 159g this season.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **129 different lineups** in 159g.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (38-40 .487): The Reds have won 11 of their last 14 home games...are **2-1** on this homestand (**2-1 vs StL**, **3g vs Pit**)...went **8-13-4** in their previous **25 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their previous 12 homestands, including each of their previous 2 homestands (**2-3**, **2-4**, **3-2**, **6-3**, **1-2**, **3-3**, **3-3**, **2-2**, **2-8**, **2-5**, **5-2**, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **279-285-1**...last season the Reds established the GABP record for victories in a season (**43-38**)...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)...**at 217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (38-43 .469): The Reds went **12-12-2** in their **26 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 7 of their 12 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, **2-5**, **2-4**, **3-3**, **2-5**, **0-6**, **3-3**, **4-2**, **4-6**, **5-1**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (179): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST** - 1, **SECOND** - 9, **THIRD** - 46, **FOURTH** - 46, **FIFTH** - 75, **SIXTH** - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g** over **.500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g** over **.500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g** over **.500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g** under **.500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **100** days below .500.

REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **979-1,020 all-time** vs the Pirates, including 11-4 this season...Cin has won the last 8g vs Pit, their longest winning streak vs the Pirates since a 9-game winning streak in 1986, **Barry Bonds'** rookie year...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 30-29 all-time, including 5-1 this season.

Last Pitched: Sat at Hou and earned the 10-4 victory (5ip, 6h, 4er, 2bb, 4k, 2hr, 1hbp, 80 pitches, 44 strikes)...left leading, 8-4...allowed solo HR to Pence in the second inning and to Tejada in the third...in the fifth allowed Tejada's RBI-single and Berkman's run scoring-GIDP.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced LEER...media guide bio is available in the press box...is making his 11th career start, all this season, and his fourth appearance since skipping a start with a sore right groin... was scheduled to start on 9/7 at Col but was scratched with the injury... **in his 3 starts since then is 2-1, 8.59 (14.2ip, 14er)**...is starting tonight instead of **LHP Matt Maloney**, who has been bothered by a blister on his left middle finger...in August led the staff in wins (3)...in his 10 starts the Reds went 6-4 and scored 57 runs (5.7 r/g)...has 3 quality starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another...on **7/31 vs Col** made his first Major League appearance since **5/22/06 for Mil at Cin** and his first career big league start...on **8/5 vs Chi** earned his first career victory since **5/18/06 vs Phi** (5-4 Brewers win)...on **8/11 at StL** singled off **Mitchell Boggs** for his first Major League hit.

Most Valuable Pitcher: Was named the International League's **Most Valuable Pitcher**...at Leigh Valley (Phillies) and Louisville combined to finish **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...tied for the International League lead in victories and ranked fourth in ERA...3 times was IL Pitcher of the Week...was the starting pitcher for the IL in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland...was recognized at the ballpark in a pre-game ceremony on Wed, along with IL Manager of the Year **Rick Sweet**.

Shutout: In his 4-0 victory on **8/5 vs the Cubs** threw a complete-game shutout in just his second Major League start (4h, 1bb, 4k)...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a shutout in his first or second career start since **Charlie Leibrandt** beat the Braves, 5-0, in his big league debut on **4/13/80** and the first pitcher to do it for any team since the Red Sox' **Clay Buchholz** threw a no-hitter on 9/1/07 vs Bal in his second career start... courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

Scattering Hits: In his 5-4 victory on **8/11 at StL**, earned the decision after allowing 11 hits, all singles, and 1 run in 6+ innings...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, became just the third pitcher since 1900 to earn a win while allowing zero or 1 run and at least 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched or less...the other 2 were Cle's **Jack Kralick** in **1965** (6ip, 11h, 1r) and Bal's **Pat Rapp** in **2000** (6ip, 11h, 1r).

2009 Season: In December was signed by the Phillies to a minor league contract and began the season with Class AAA Lehigh Valley (8g, 7gs, 5-2, 4.75)...on 5/22 was traded to the Reds in exchange for cash...went 8-1, 2.51 in 11 starts and 1 relief appearance at Class AAA Louisville before he was promoted on 7/31 to take the spot in the rotation vacated by **RHP Micah Owings**, who went on the disabled list with a tight right shoulder...overall at Class AAA went **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...when promoted, his 13 victories tied for the most among all minor league pitchers...3 times was International League Pitcher of the Week, including twice for Leigh Valley in the first 5 weeks of the season and from **7/20-7/26** for Louisville (2gs, 2-0, 1.88)...was IL's starting pitcher in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: RHP Johnny Cueto

Last Pitched: Sun at Hou and suffered the 3-2 loss (7.1ip, 6h, 3er, 5bb, 5k, 1hr, 1wp, 111 pitches, 65 strikes)...left trailing, 3-2... allowed a pair of run-scoring groundouts to Berkman and Lee in the third inning and a solo HR to Quintero in the fourth.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander tomorrow will make his 30th start of the season, his sixth since a stint on the disabled list with inflammation in his right shoulder...was on the DL from **8/20-8/31**...in 5 starts since then is **2-1, 3.14** (28.2ip, 10er)...missed a scheduled start on 9/17 vs Fla with a throat infection...ranks second in the Major Leagues in hit batsmen (14, Mil's Dave Bush 15) and 3 times hit 2 batters in a game...in his 29 starts the Reds went 15-14 and scored 119 runs (4.10 r/g)...in 10 of his 29 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 18 of his 29 starts threw at least 6.0 innings.

Streaking: The 6-3 win on 8/31 vs Pit snapped his career-high 6-game losing streak...through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69 and made a strong bid for a spot on the National League All-Star team... **in his next 8 starts, from 7/6-8/15, went 0-6, 10.64** until he went on the DL...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went **4-0, 1.25**...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since **Tim Belcher** had a 4-game run from **5/27-6/13, 1992** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

Quality: Has 14 quality starts...put together 2 strings of 5 consecutive QS (4/22-5/13, 5/24-6/14).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).
